

What current tests are changing? What are the new tests?

New FY25 Tests English Language Acquisition & Math



^{*}Programs may choose to administer one or both CASAS STEPS tests.

Can I pre-test with the FY24 version of a test and post-test with the new version?

NO!

Pre- and Post-Test with the Same Test Series

Students must always be pre- and post-tested with the same test series.

For example, you cannot pre-test with **CASAS Life and Work Reading** and post-test with **CASAS Reading STEPS.**

You cannot pretest with CASAS Math GOALS and post-test with CASAS Math GOALS 2.


Can I apply the 120-day rule to carry over FY24 test scores to FY25?

Applying the 120-day Rule

Of the FY24 tests, only **TABE 11/12** (Reading and Math) and **CASAS Reading GOALS** can carry over to FY25 with the 120-day rule.

All other tests are expiring at the end of FY24.

Students with enough instructional hours must be post-tested with the FY24 tests by the end of FY24 instruction and assessed with a new test series for FY25.



Of the FY24 tests, the 120 day rule applies to these tests ONLY

Why are the tests changing?

NRS Educational Functioning Levels

EFLs

The NRS describes 6 levels of adult language learners.

The standardized tests that students take place them in one of the 6 levels.

When students move from one level to the next after post-testing, they earn a Measurable Skill Gain (MSG).

Beginning ESL Literacy - NRS Level 1

Low Beginning ESL - NRS Level 2

High Beginning ESL - NRS Level 3

Low Intermediate ESL - NRS Level 4

High Intermediate ESL - NRS Level 5

Advanced ESL - NRS Level 6

For FY25, there are new EFL descriptors & new assessments to measure them.

The tests are changing because...

All New ELA Tests

- Are aligned with the federal English Language Proficiency Standards for Adult Education (ELPS)
- Assess new NRS Educational Functioning Level (EFL) descriptors

The ELPS were released in 2016, but the pandemic delayed the development and federal approval of new assessments until now.

The goal of the ELPS is to assist adult English learners to achieve competency in English language acquisition and rigorous academic content to facilitate transition to post-secondary education, job training, or employment.

CASAS Math GOALS 2

- Is an updated version of the original CASAS Math GOALS test
- Has 5 levels instead of the current 2

CASAS Tests

CASAS eTests

- CASAS eTests units (WTUs or TEUs) never expire and can be used for any CASAS test.

- Programs must order a minimum of one Test Administration Manual per test series per program site. To order, access the online CASAS Catalog HERE.

- Automatic and error-free scoring
- Access to student reports
- More efficient use of staff & student time
- Automatically assigns the correct next test
- No need to buy new paper tests
- Can use the <u>Assessment Hub</u>

CASAS Tests

CASAS Paper Tests

- Paper test booklets for Life and Work Reading and Math GOALS expire June 30, 2024, and must be shredded.
- Programs must purchase new paper test materials (including Appraisals and a minimum of one Test Administration Manual per test series per site) for CASAS STEPS and Math GOALS 2.

BEST Plus Tests

- Current BEST Plus 2.0 tests will NOT transfer to the new BEST Plus 3.0.
- Unused tests are not returnable or exchangeable. Programs must purchase new BEST Plus 3.0 tests for FY25.
- Programs must order directly from the publisher, the Center for Applied Linguistics (CAL). FY25 pricing is found on this page.
- Discounted pricing and ordering through Curriculum Publications Clearinghouse (CPC)
 will not be available for BEST Plus 3.0.
 - As of 2/5/24, tests are not yet available for purchase.

BEST Literacy Tests

- Paper test booklets expire June 30, 2024, and must be shredded.
- Programs must buy new BEST Literacy 2.0 test booklets for FY25.
- Programs must order directly from the publisher, the Center for Applied Linguistics (CAL). FY25 pricing information is found on this page.
- Discounted pricing and ordering through the Curriculum Publications Clearinghouse (CPC) will not be available for BEST Literacy 2.0. As of 2/5/24, tests are not yet available for purchase.

In deciding which new tests to use for FY25, what are some key considerations about each new test?



CASAS Reading STEPS: Key Considerations



- Reading STEPS Level A begins at a lower level than CASAS Life Work Reading Level A, thus eliminating the need for a separate literacy level test.
- For students with very low literacy levels or minimal test-taking skills, the Level A test can be administered as a consumable test booklet. The eTest, which is touch screen compatible, is another option for low literacy students.
- Some test items, particularly those at higher levels, are more academic in nature than CASAS Life and Work Reading. This is because STEPS is aligned with the English Language Proficiency Standards (ELPS).
- The exit criteria for Advanced ESL on Reading STEPS is 239+
 (Life and Work Reading is 236+)

NRS Level Breakdown



NRS EFL	ESL Level	Reading STEPS Scale Score Ranges	
1	Beginning ESL Literacy	160 - 183	
2	Low Beginning ESL	184 - 196	
3	High Beginning ESL	197 - 206	
4	Low Intermediate ESL	207 - 216	
5	High Intermediate ESL	217 - 227	
6	Advanced ESL (Completed Advanced ESL)	228 - 238	

New ESL Exit Criteria for Reading

CASAS Listening STEPS: Key Considerations



- Listening STEPS should be administered through CASAS eTests with students wearing headsets to hear the audio test items (microphones not needed).
 The paper version is not recommended as it relies on CDs to provide the audio test items, and only one level can be administered at a time.
- Listening STEPS can be administered along with Reading STEPS to provide a more accurate picture of a student's overall language proficiency than a reading test alone.
- If both Listening STEPS and Reading STEPS are administered as pre-tests, students should be placed according to the <u>lower</u> score and post-tested with the test with the <u>lower</u> score.
- Listening STEPS can be administered to students who meet exit criteria on Reading STEPS to see if they are still in need of ELA instruction for aural/oral skills before transitioning to ABE or workforce instruction.

BEST Plus 3.0: Key Considerations



- Like BEST Plus 2.0, BEST Plus 3.0 is given as a one-on-one oral interview. The tester
 uses a computer to score each item before giving the next. Students do not use a
 computer.
- The Illinois PDN will not provide training or technical assistance for BEST Plus 3.0.

BEST Literacy 2.0: Key Considerations



- BEST Literacy 2.0 test booklets are consumable and cannot be reused.
- BEST Literacy 2.0 only assesses NRS Levels 1-4. Students who pre-test into NRS Level 4 (Low Intermediate) will need to be re-tested with another test series (such as CASAS STEPS) to show movement out of Level 4, incurring additional expense for programs. Note: The original BEST Literacy tested NRS Levels 1-5, so this is a significant change.
- The Illinois PDN will not provide training or technical assistance for BEST Literacy 2.0.
 All training and technical assistance must be provided by the publisher, the Center for Applied Linguistics (CAL), at the cost of the program.

Math GOALS 2: Key Considerations



- Has 5 levels as opposed to only 2 in the original version
- Having 5 levels will improve placement accuracy and ability to demonstrate student progress, as the new test is more tightly aligned with the *Illinois* ABE/ASE Content Standards and the College and Career Readiness Standards.

What training will test proctors need for the new tests?

Training to Proctor the New CASAS Tests

 Already trained CASAS proctors (both paper proctors and eTest proctors) will need to complete a brief iLEARN training to administer the new FY25 CASAS tests.

New CASAS proctors are required to attend CASAS Implementation Training
offered by the Illinois PDN. Implementation Training is required for all persons
that proctor CASAS paper or eTests and is applicable to all CASAS tests.
Registration for the next training (April 5) opens soon.

Training to Administer & Score BEST Plus 3.0

- All BEST Plus 3.0 test administrators, including those currently certified to administer BEST Plus 2.0, are required to complete BEST Plus 3.0 training.
- Through August 2024, the test publisher will offer a free self-access online training course for BEST Plus 3.0. As of 2/5/24, this course is not yet available.
- After August 2024, the online course will be available for \$125 per person.
 The publisher will also offer live virtual training for \$325 per person.
- The Illinois Adult Education PDN will not provide technical assistance or training for BEST Plus 3.0 test administrators.

Training to Administer & Score BEST Literacy 2.0

- Test administrators and scorers are required to read the BEST Literacy 2.0 Test
 Manual before administering and scoring the test.
- A strongly recommended (but optional) self-access online training course will be available from the test publisher for \$50 per person. As of 2/5/24, this course is not yet available.
- The Illinois Adult Education PDN will not provide training or technical assistance for BEST Literacy 2.0 test administrators.
